

The DAADS Prize (valued at €1,000) is aimed at international students and doctoral students who have distinguished themselves both through exceptional academic performance and outstanding social or intercultural commitment.

Students can be nominated by: their department (Fachbereich), a TUHH professor, or the head of a respective unit (Arbeitsbereich). Self-nomination is not possible.

The formal criteria are:

- Students can be nominated by: their department (Fachbereich), a TUHH professor, or the head of a respective unit (Arbeitsbereich). Self-nomination is not possible.
- The candidates must have achieved both outstanding academic results and shown remarkable social commitment. Students should be in the advanced stages of their bachelor's (at least 2nd year of study) or master's (at least 2nd semester) programs; recently graduated students (whose degree is no more than 3 months old) and doctoral students can also be nominated.
- The DAAD Prize is not a research prize and is not intended to honour a doctoral thesis.
- The DAAD Prize can only be awarded to an individual person and not to groups.

The award ceremony will take place as part of the semester opening ceremony in each winter semester.
